### **Additional Rules:**

- Must be 25 yrs or older to rent
- Security Deposit if you damage the home, you may be charged up to \$500.
- Home is on a septic system. Please do not pour grease down the drains and please do not flush any feminine hygiene products. TP and waste only.
- If using the outdoor fire pit. Please make sure fire is completely extinguished when finished. Please replace cover when cooled
- Please do not use white towels for cleanup of spills, there are rags in the laundry room.

## **Check out Instructions:**

- Check out is 10 am. Please be respectful of this so that cleaners may come and prepare for our next guests.
- Put bed sheets and toweling in bathtub before departure.
- Please do not leave food or beverages in the home or refrigerator upon departure.
- There is no trash pickup in the area. Please remove trash upon departure and take to Recycling center on your way into Franklin.(Located on Hwy 64 on right, about 4 miles).
- Check grill make sure it's clean, cold and covered. Also turn off propane.
- Please wash and put away any dishes used.
- If the outdoor furniture was used, please recover.
- Make sure all lights and appliances are turned off and all windows and doors locked. Return the key to the lockbox and secure.

# House Manual

## Kitchen:

Pots and pans - Located in lower cabinets in Kitchen Island

Refrigerator - has filtered water with ice and water in the door.

Dishwasher- Controls are on top of door. Place dishwasher pods in the soap dispenser.

Grill - please brush before use if needed and after. Make sure it is covered before checkout and propane is turned off. Grill tools located in drawer to right of Dishwasher.

# **Living Room:**

Roku TV - No cable included. Streaming channels only. Please do not sign out of our Amazon Prime acct. you may use it, just no purchases. Turn TV on with Silver GE remote. Use this remote for volume control also. Roku Remote, hit home button, then scroll through the apps to select streaming channels. Remotes located in drawer in coffee table

Thermostat - The Home Screen is the default display, it displays the current temperature in our home. To adjust temperature, tap screen and using your finger, drag the adjustment slider back and forth to manually lower or raise the temperature. The thermostat has sensors that will detect occupancy and adjust accordingly. Games and books inside coffee table storage. Lift center panel and then sides will slide out to access storage.

# Laundry:

Laundry pods and dryer sheets on shelf.

There are rags in basket for use in cleaning up any spills, please do not use white towels for cleanup.

### **Deck Furniture:**

Please place covers in deck box and then recover furniture when finished. This will help keep it clean for next guests. Thank you.

# Things to Do

The mountains and valleys of Western North Carolina offer breathtaking beauty and plenty of opportunities for relaxation, adventure and fun. Right at the center of all the fun things to do in the NC mountains, you'll discover Franklin, a charming town that is the perfect destination for romantic getaways, camping trips, family vacations or weekend getaways.

In a valley surrounded by some of the oldest mountains on earth, the Cherokee called the area that is now Franklin, NC, "Nikwasi" or "center of activity". Nikwasi was an ancient and important Cherokee town. The remains of Nikwasi Mound are still visible in downtown Franklin on East Main Street.

Franklin is the seat of Macon County, NC which was formed in 1828. The land was part of lands acquired from the Cherokee in the Treaty of 1819. The county is named for Nathaniel Macon, a politician from Warrenton, NC who served in the American Revolution and the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate. The Town of Franklin was officially incorporated in 1855.

Franklin is situated one hour from Asheville, NC and two hours from Atlanta, Georgia, Knoxville, Tennessee, and Greenville, South Carolina.

# Scottish Tartans Museum

As the only one of its kind in the United States, this museum is a direct extension of the Scottish Tartans Society in Scotland. The museum not only displays Scottish Tartans, but covers various aspects

of the Scottish experience - culture, history, dress, migration and military. Visitors are invited to view their family tartan, connect with their clan, and learn about the history of Highland dress. The gift shop is open to the public. Admission to the Museum: \$4 plus tax adults, 12 - 7 years old - \$2 plus tax and 6 and under free. Open year round. Tuesday - Saturday 10 a.m. - 4 p.m.

# **Macon County Historical Museum**

Located on Main Street in downtown Franklin, this museum is housed in the J. R. Pendergrass building which is listed on the National Registery of Historic Places. The building is an excellent and little altered example of early twentieth century retails store design. # **Ruby City Gem Museum**

This museum located in downtown Franklin has specimens, artifacts, ivory carvings, rare gems and more. You can see hundreds of spheres handmade from different types of stone by the founder of the store. "The World's Largest sapphire" weighing 385 pounds, as well as, one of the largest gem quality rubies found in the area (162 carats) are on display. Be sure to see an authentic shrunken head, a section of local arrowheads and the black-light section is a must see. Free to the public and cameras are welcome. Open Year Round with winter hours during January and February.
